SWIZZLING SENSATIONS

Joseph Boroski, the creator of our latest cocktail menu, gives us gives us an inside look into the mind - and palate - of a mixologist and bartender extraordinaire



"I have been coming to the Philippines for many years, and each visits greets me with new and incomparable fresh ingredients. Of course, I had to utilize the local mangoes, which are to me undoubtedly some of the best in the world, for **Mabuhay**

(Welcome to Manila House).

For **Palmeras**, I created a variation of an orgeat, a French floral almond syrup, using local pili nuts to make a creamier and more flavorful version of the original.

Ashitaba in **Spritz Me Please** is a medicinal leafy herb that is mostly from Japan, but a specific Philippine varietal imparts a gently nutty and earthy character.

Nata de coco, used in *Mabuhay*(Welcome To Manila House)
and Sana Maulit Muli, is an absolutely delicious product made from the local young coconuts and an ingredient that works very nicely in cocktails.

Morang, in *Himala*, a relative of jackfruit, is a fruit I've only come across in the Philippines, and is creamy with a pleasantly unique flavor.

Asin tibuok, used in *Galleon Trade*, is one of the most unique and flavorful salts I've ever come across. Produced according to a 500-year-old tradition, it is a rare product created by a labor-intensive process of soaking coconut husks that are brined in ash over the course of years."

Mei Afable-Avanceña, a disciple of the late, great Chabet, finds her voice in a new and powerful exhibition



Chimaera is a word with many meanings. In mythology, it is a fire-breathing monster with a lion's head, a goat's body, and a serpent's tail. In biology, it is an organism that contains a mix of genetically different tissues. In prose, it is thing that is hoped for but is illusory. This body of work is a compelling depiction of art as an unfolding story, shaped by the artist's experience of significant events that have left an indelible mark on her life and on society. A flood. A pandemic.

Precious books that were damaged and permanently altered during a devastating flood became art material and provided the backdrop for many of the pieces. The artist found that cutting and tearing these books to serve another purpose moved her. The process of tearing seemed akin to drawing, which begins with scratching a surface with lines to create shape and form. While the books had lost their conventional purpose, they were transmuted into another meaningful object.

Stifled by the lockdowns brought about by the COVID-19 pandemic, the omnipresence of the internet greatly influenced the artist's visual experience through an array of current events, documentaries, pop culture, and social media. Nevertheless, while Instagram filters, digital displays, and the like inspired the colour palette; the artist pays homage to the power of nature that, not only devastates through floods, but also inspires the artist to break free and take flight – just as the birds that beckoned at her window.

Chimaera revels in the multiplicity of meaning in art from the moment of its creation to the moment it is perceived by its audience. It is a moving feast of colour, rich texture, and layers of meaning that is embedded, yet shifts in context. Images are torn and distorted but are reconfigured and reborn in another context. Chimaera screams against the seeming randomness of experience and celebrates humanity's ability to change, adapt, and be whole.

Losing Your Memory: Normal Ageing or Dementia?

Memory loss may be a normal part of ageing, but it may also be caused by dementia or treatable brain conditions. Getting the right diagnosis and care is important.

An elderly man could not find his way home after his daily routine of morning walk and breakfast at the nearby market. A lady in her mid 60s wore the same blouse over and over again, insisting it was the most comfortable piece in her wardrobe. A recently retired professional realised he had difficulty paying his bills, taking a much longer time to tally his monthly credit card statements.

Are these just cases of a lapse in memory?

Ronald Reagan, former President, United States of America, suffered a progressive decline in his brain functions, and was later diagnosed with Alzheimer's disease in 1994. Eight years before that, his son claimed that his father could not remember the names of the familiar California canyons he was flying over. He passed away at the age of 93 in 2004.

The number of patients suffering from dementia is alarming. Locally, the projected number of those aged 65 years and above in 2020 will hit 53,000, and this will further increase to 187,000 by 2020.

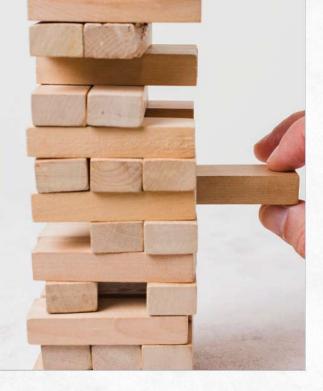
With a dwindling ratio of working adults to older dependents, the care burden on society is expected to be massive. Are we prepared for the silver tsunami?



Losing your memory?

Memory loss is a common, significant symptom in patients with dementia. Other symptoms include language difficulty, impaired thinking and judgment, inability to plan and complete complex tasks, changes in personality, inappropriate behaviour, agitation and paranoia. Observations from immediate family members are very helpful in establishing an early and rapid diagnosis.

Careful, thorough examination may alert the physician to other common conditions such as anxiety, depression, sleep disorders, stroke and Parkinson's disease. Nutritional deficiencies, hormonal imbalances and reactions to medication may also result in an impairment in cognitive function. Blood tests are therefore useful in the evaluation of these conditions.



Getting the right diagnosis

Brain scans are often performed to ensure that there is no damage in the brain. For instance, the presence of a bleeding between the surface of the brain and the covering over the brain may cause symptoms similar to dementia. Enlarged ventricles in the brain may also cause memory loss, in addition to walking difficulty and poor urinary control.

Needless to say, it is important to establish the correct diagnosis, as the course of treatment and predicted outcomes are vastly different for each condition.

How is dementia treated?

Cholinesterase inhibitors and memantine are medications that may help slow or reduce the development of symptoms. Physical exercises improve strength and cardiovascular fitness while slowing down the progression of cognitive decline. Participation in games and engagement in thinking activities may be helpful. Establishing a daily routine of social and physical activities is therefore very important in the care of dementia patients.

Communication becomes increasingly difficult and challenging as dementia worsens over time. It is common for the caregivers to feel very frustrated and worn out. Having a plan early in the course of the disease will help address uncertainties in managing financial and legal issues, as well as in identifying long-term care options.

Researchers are racing against time in an attempt to better understand dementia and hopefully discover the elusive cure for such a dreadful degeneration of the brain. Meanwhile, we must continue to rally around these patients and their families, providing them with unwavering love, care and social support. A person may lose control of their brain functions, yet they can still retain the dignity of living and the beauty of life.



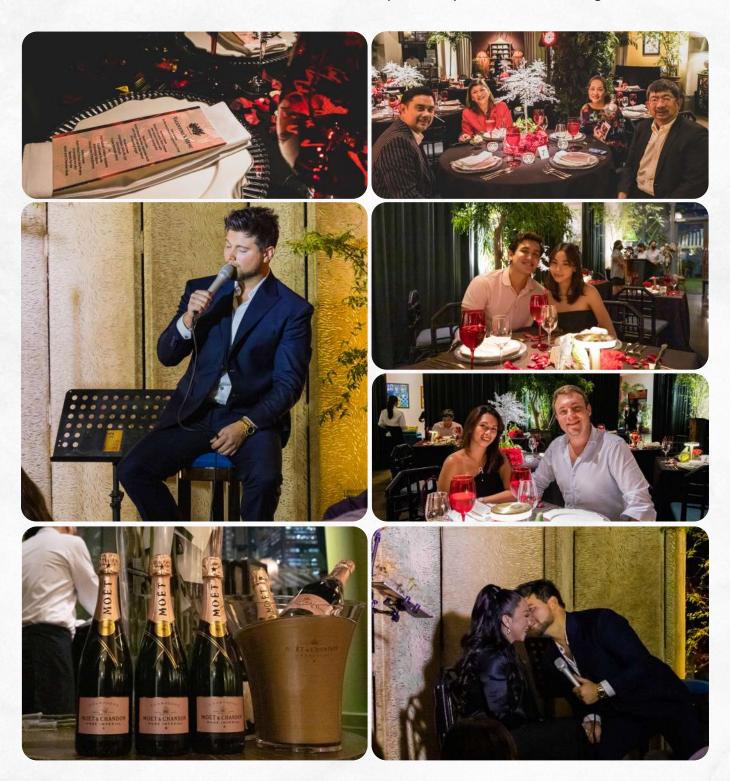

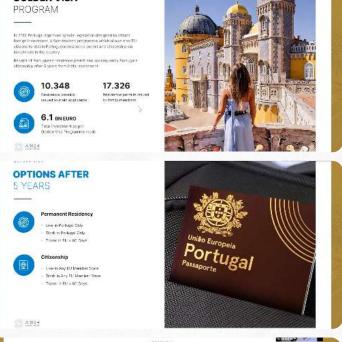

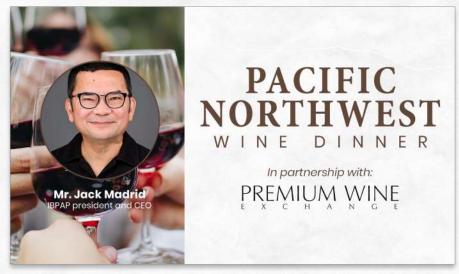
